FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR C

3 July 2022

The link between the First Reading and Gospel is not immediately apparent today, until you look at the “headings” which are always chosen “to make the connection between readings of the same Mass clear.” (Introduction to the Lectionary n.123.) The “headings” present us with a simple picture today: a river of peace flowing out from the Lord, which we see in the Gospel as the flowing of the disciples as they are sent out on their first mission. From the Lord of Peace, others, like ripples in a pool, flow out carrying his simple message: “Peace to this house!”

PARISH OF DIVINE MERCY PRAYER

Lord Jesus Christ, help us never to abandon your ways. As you have loved and shown us your mercy, may we sincerely express our love for God by loving our neighbour and being merciful to them. Jesus, King of Divine Mercy, we trust in you.

2. READINGS

First: Isaiah 66:10-14 - Rejoice Jerusalem ... now I send flowing peace like a river ... to his servants the Lord will reveal his hand.

Psalms: 65 - Cry out with joy to God all the earth / before you all the earth shall bow / He turned the sea into dry land / Come and hear all who fear God.

Second: Galatians 6:14-18 - What matters is for [a person] to become a new creature - peace and mercy to all who follow this rule, who form the Israel of God - the marks on my body are those of Jesus.

Gospel: Luke 10:1-12, 17-20 - Jesus sends the 72 out - the harvest is rich, but the labourers are few ... let your first words be "peace to this house" ... rejoice that your names are written in heaven.

3. HOPE IN THE FUTURE PRAYER CYCLE

Let us pray for the people of the parish of St. Robert of Newminster, Levenshulme and Longsight, and for Fr. Michael Dever, their parish priest. We pray for their parish primary schools, St. Peter's High School, and for the Sisters of Our Lady of the Missions. May peace, like a river, flow in abundance.
