TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR C

4 September 2022

This is a very difficult set of readings. The Gospel itself starts with a saying which many find hard to understand: must we really 'hate' our family to be the Lord's disciples? The point is that it is *relative*: what are we prepared to give up for the Gospel? Are we going to try and make our own cross, or accept whatever we are given? Jesus is probably trying to discourage the crowd of sensation seekers and hangers-on who are crowding round him. He wants real disciples, who are aware of the possible cost: not like the incompetent builder, or the useless king. To be a disciple, one must be prepared to follow Jesus anywhere, whatever it might cost in possessions, family or friends. We may never understand why, but then, 'who can know the intentions of God?'

Lord Jesus Christ, help us never to abandon your ways. As you have loved and shown us your mercy, may we sincerely express our love for God by loving our neighbour and being merciful to them. Jesus, King of Divine Mercy, we trust in you.

First: Wisdom 9:13-18 - Who can know the intentions of God? ... Who could have learned your intention, had you not granted Wisdom?

Psalms: 89 - O Lord you have been our refuge from one generation to the next / You turn men back into dust / You sweep men away like a dream / Make us know the shortness of our life / In the morning fill us with your love.

Second: Philemon 9:10, 12-17 - Paul sends Onesimus back to the community, not as a slave anymore but as a dear brother in Christ. He asks the community to welcome him.

Gospel: Luke 14: 25-33 - Anyone who does not carry his cross and follow me cannot be my disciple ... none of you can be my disciple unless he gives up all his possessions.
