THE WORD THIS WEEK

PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD YEAR A

2 April 2023

On Palm Sunday the long reading of the Passion dominates the celebration, and in a sense its meaning is obvious. Do not allow this, however, to detract from the other readings, which give the vital context necessary for understanding the Passion as more than just a long story. It is our story - the tale of how God achieved OUR salvation by the supreme sacrifice of Jesus Christ.

PARISH OF DIVINE MERCY PRAYER

Lord Jesus Christ, help us never to abandon your ways. As you have loved and shown us your mercy, may we sincerely express our love for God by loving our neighbour and being merciful to them. Jesus, King of Divine Mercy, we trust in you.

2. READINGS

First: Isaiah 50: 4-9a - The Lord has given me a disciple's tongue ... I offered my back to those who struck me ... It is the Lord GOD who helps me.

Psalm: 31:9-16 - Be gracious to me, O LORD, for I am in distress / For my life is spent with sorrow / I am the scorn of all my adversaries / But I trust in you, O LORD; I say, "You are my God."

Second: Philippians 2:5-11 - His state was divine yet Christ Jesus ... was humbler yet, even to accepting death on a cross. But God raised him high.

Gospel: Matthew 26:14 - 27:66 - The Passion, from Judas making a deal with the chief priests to betray Jesus to them, through to Joseph of Arimathea being given Jesus's body, and the Pharisees getting permission to put a special guard at the tomb.

3. HOPE IN THE FUTURE - REFLECTION FOR PALM

SUNDAY: During Holy Week we reflect on the Passion of Jesus as we share his journey from the triumphant entry into Jerusalem to His victory over death on the cross. This was a difficult and lonely journey for Jesus: Judas betrayed him. Peter denied knowing Him. His other friends abandoned Him and fled in fear. He was rejected, wrongly condemned, and suffered death on the cross. Throughout His journey, however, we see Jesus' perfect obedience to His Father's will and His love for us. There was no anger or hatred. Jesus demonstrated His service to others as He washed the feet of his disciples and showed mercy and forgiveness to those who persecuted Him. Jesus' final prayer of surrender highlights His firm desire to fulfil His Father's will. 'Father, into your hands I place my spirit!' (Luke 23:46) Let us reflect on the kind of followers of Jesus we are. Are we strong in faith, putting our trust in God when faced with challenging times or do we easily give into temptation? Lord, Jesus, we pray that we may follow your example of humility, mercy and forgiveness. Stay with us, Lord, on our journey.


