Jesus tells a dramatic story in the Gospel, to make a very important point: the desperate need in our world for forgiveness and reconciliation. How many chances do we give each other? As many as seven? How often do we shut doors on people, even family and friends, saying 'That's it; you've just gone too far this time: never again'? When Jesus says that we must forgive 'seventy-seven' times, he implies that we never stop forgiving, whatever happens. He doesn't just say this, however: even when they do the worst thing that could be done to him, nailing him to a cross, Jesus puts these words into practice: 'Father, forgive them...' As his disciples, we must do likewise.

Lord Jesus Christ, help us never to abandon your ways. As you have loved and shown us your mercy, may we sincerely express our love for God by loving our neighbour and being merciful to them. Jesus, King of Divine Mercy, we trust in you.

First: Ecclesiasticus / Sirach 27: 3 - 28:7 - Describes the consequences of anger and resentment and instructs the reader to live by the commandments.

Psalm 102 - The Lord is compassion and love, slow to anger and rich in mercy / My soul give thanks to the Lord / It is he who forgives your guilt / His wrath will come to an end / For as the heavens are high above the earth.

Second: Romans 14: 7-9 - The life and death of each of us has influence on others ... dead or alive we belong to the Lord.

Gospel: Matthew 18: 21-35 - Jesus tells Peter that he must forgive seventy times seven and recounts the parable of the servant whose debts where forgiven, but who then did not forgive the debts that were owed to him.

8. SAINTS OF THE WEEK

ST MATTHEW, APOSTLE AND EVANGELIST - 21 **SEPTEMBER**: St Matthew was born at Capernaum. He was a tax gatherer when called by Jesus. He wrote his Gospel in Hebrew, and tradition has it that he preached the faith in the East.

ST PIUS OF PIETRELCINA, PRIEST – 23 SEPTEMBER: was born on 25 May 1887. He entered the novitiate of the Capuchin Friars aged 16 and was ordained a priest in 1910. He

lived a remarkable devotion to prayer and the sacraments. He committed himself to relieving the pain of many families, chiefly through the foundation of the "House for the Relief of Suffering". He died in 1968.
