We arrive at the fiftieth day - the completion of the Easter Season, and the completion of the Paschal Mystery: the Lord has died, is risen, has ascended to heaven and now gives birth to his Church, by sending the Spirit upon the apostles. This feast of the gift of the Spirit is so significant for us because it marks the handing on of Jesus' ministry to the Church - in the Church we are guaranteed the presence of the Lord, in his sacraments, in his ministers, in the Blessed Sacrament and in his Celebrated Word. It also marks the fulfilment of our thoughts about baptism throughout this season: the gift of the Spirit which we receive in Confirmation is the `seal' of our baptism, guaranteeing and confirming all that baptism achieves.

Gospel: John 15:26-27, 16:12-15 - Jesus tells the disciples that the Spirit of truth will come to them and lead them to the complete truth.

12. SAINTS OF THE WEEK

ST RITA –22 **MAY:** was born in Cascia, Italy, in 1381. She endured an abusive marriage for eighteen years until her husband was murdered in a local feud. Her two sons died shortly afterwards. She was professed as an Augustinian nun and worked hard to end the feuds between local warring families, in which she was successful. She died in 1457 and is patron saint of abused wives and mothers.

CHADDERTON & HOLLINWOOD **ST BEDE THE VENERABLE, PRIEST, DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH - 25 MAY:** was born in 673 and was educated by the Benedictines. He joined the monastery and began a life of great erudition, producing many writings: particularly on the Scriptures and History of the Church in Britain. He died in 735.
